College Library to Bear Name of Eminent Scholar

The beautiful, new brick-veneered library building on the campus of Pacific Bible college, recently completed, will be dedicated in a special service at 10:30 a. m. next Wednesday.

It will be formally named the Otto F. Linn library, in honor of the dean of the college, who is a nationally famous Greek and Hebrew scholar. The spacious fireproof library and classroom building

was designed by Architect Glen Stanton.

Dr. Linn was a member of the advisory board chosen by the International Council of Religious Education to bring forth the Revised Standard Version of the Bible, published in 1952. Dr. Linn represented the Church of God on the board. He was chosen because of his aptitude in two languages—Greek and Hebrew. Most of his work concerned the New Testament.

Program highlights: Chairman, the Rev. A. Clarence Roper, college treasurer; invocation, the Rev. H. C. Wolkow, trustee; Scripture, the Rev. Orval L. Kerr, trustee; greetings from Portland Library association, Bernard Van Horne, librarian; address, Prof. Milo L. Chapman, college vice president; presentation of key, the Rev. Arthur C. Ely, trustee; citation and dedicatory prayer, Dr. A. F. Gray, college president; music by a cappella choir, and girl's sextet.

THE ANNUAL college ingathering festival will precede the dedication, starting Tuesday night. Several hundred ministers and laymen from California and Northwest states are expected. Several thousand dollars worth of foodstuffs and produce are given the college yearly from Church of God groups in 11 western states.

Festivities will start at 5:30 p. m. Tuesday with an open house of campus buildings. At 7:30 p. m. there will be concert by the Four Flats in the college chapel, when gifts will be acknowledged.

Out-of-town guests will be entertained overnight in homes and will be college guests for breakfast Wednesday.

THE INGATHERING dedication service will be at 9 a. m. Wednesday in the campus chapel.
