## **College Library to Bear** Name of Eminent Scholar

The beautiful, new brick-veneered library building on the campus of Pacific Bible college,

recently completed, will be dedicated in a special service at 10:30 a.m. next Wednesdav.

It will be formally named the Otto F. Linn library, in hon-or of the dean of the college, who is a na-

was designed by Architect Glen Stanton.

Out-of-town guests will be entertained overnight in homes and will be college guests for breakfast Wednesday.
