Dr. Otto F. Linn, who has | New Testament and has written served as dean of Pacific Bible collège here since 1942, was forced by failing health to resign his position.

His resignation was accepted, re-luctantly, in the college business meet-ing held here this week during the West Coast Ministerial Assembly of the Church of God.

He will be succeeded by the

Rev. Milo Chapman, teacher in the departments of theology and Old Testament. He joined the staff in 1950.

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Dr. Linn's formal education began in a one-room grade school in Okiahoma. He worked his way through high school in Marquette, Kas., completing in three years the four-year course, He also was active in sports. During his senior high school year, he dedicated his life to Christian service. He has service as evangelist, teacher, home missionary and foreign missionary. He received his AB degree in 1929 and falls ES and MA in education in 1936 received his Anderson, Ind., for six, years, and in 1935 received his Ph.D from the divinity school of the University of Chicago.

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DR. LINN is recognized by scholars throughout the United States as an authority on the five commentaries. He served on the board for the American Revised Standard edition of the New Testament, published in 1946, and later was selected to
