## Ex-College Dean Dies In Portland

Funeral for the Rev. Dr. Otto F. Linn, minister, religious scholar and educator, will be at 2 p.m., Monday, in Holladay Park Church of God. Private interment will follow in Riverview Cemetery.

The Rev. Dr. Linn died Thursday at his home at 722 SE 111th Ave. He was born June 27, 1887, in Falun, Kan.

He was ordained a minister of the Church of God in 1912 and was pastor of churches at Anthony and Caldwell, Kan., until 1923. From 1923 until 1925, the Rev. Dr. Linn lived in Denmark where he was supervisor of the Church of God and editor of Evangelii Basun, a religious periodical.

He was educated at Phillips University and University of Chicago Divinity School where he received his doctor of philosophy degree in 1935.

A member of the board for the American Revised Standard edition of the New Testament which was published in 1946, he was the Church of God representative on a multidemoninational advisory board for a completely revised Bible which was published in 1952.

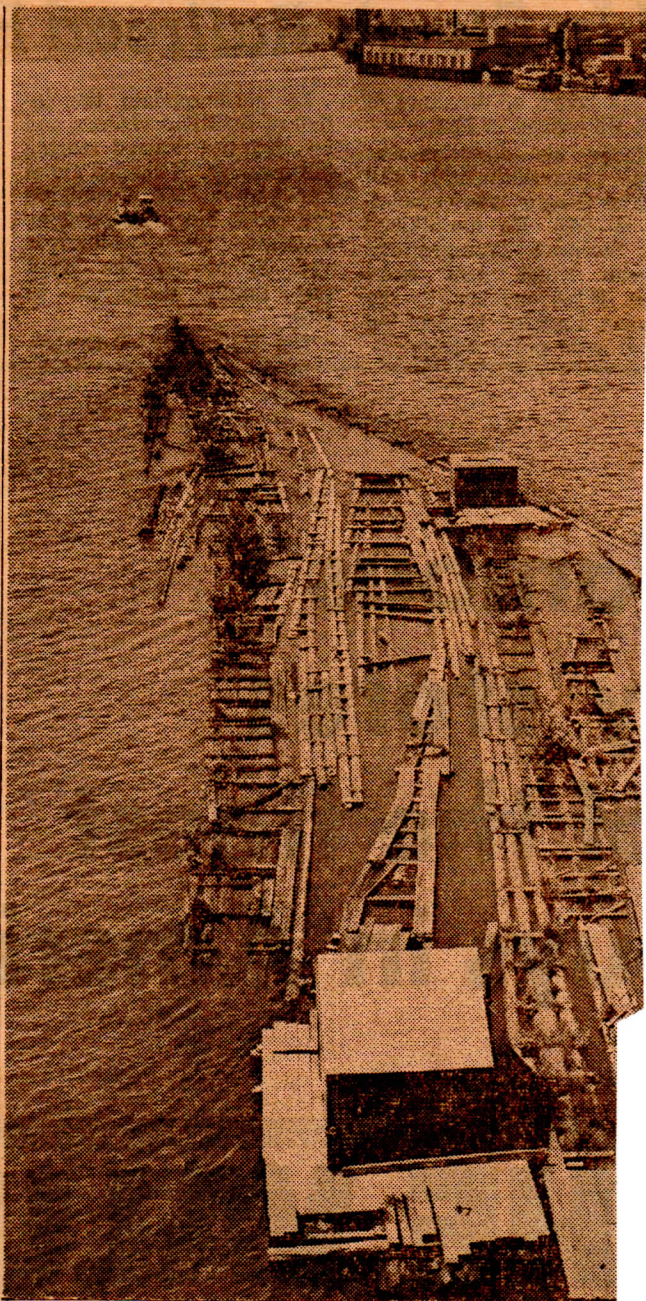
He became dean of Pacific Bible College—now Warner Pacific College—in Portland in 1942, and served in that capacity until his retirement in 1955.

Survivors include the widow, Julia, at home; a son, Valdar, Milwaukie; two daughters, Mrs. Twanda Gustafson, West Linn, and Mrs. Sheila Rameriz, Mexico City; two brothers, Ernest, Wichita, Kan., and Will, in Texas, and seven grandchildren.
